What can school meals tell us about a country? Let's explore how Finland, Japan, and the US feed their students!

In Finland, every student aged 6 to 18 enjoys a free school lunch. These meals __31__ just food: They bring people together. Students and teachers eat together, and older students often help younger ones at lunchtime. Meals feature local ingredients like fish, potatoes, and root vegetables, encouraging healthy eating habits from an early age. This approach helps __32__ equality, because no child is left behind.

Taiwan's old-house cafés represent a meaningful connection between past and present. Built mainly during the Japanese colonial period and after World War II, many of these __36__ originally functioned as family homes, shops, or government offices before falling into neglect as modern development took over.
