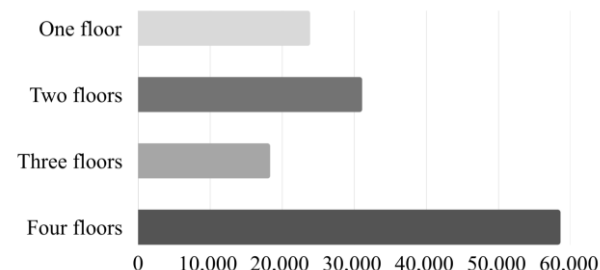

What can school meals tell us about a country? Let's explore how Finland, Japan, and the US feed their students!

In Finland, every student aged 6 to 18 enjoys a free school lunch. These meals __31__ just food: They bring people together. Students and teachers eat together, and older students often help younger ones at lunchtime. Meals feature local ingredients like fish, potatoes, and root vegetables, encouraging healthy eating habits from an early age. This approach helps __32__ equality, because no child is left behind.

In some countries, schools serve meals without meat every Monday. This is part of a movement called Meatless Monday. In 2003,

Sid Lerner, an American businessman, established this movement together with the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. Lerner's idea was based on the conditions during World Wars I and II, when people had "meatless days" to save meat for soldiers. Today, the goal is to improve our health and protect Earth.

Meat-free meals are great for our bodies. Foods such as fruits, vegetables, beans, and nuts give our bodies a variety of vitamins and help lower the risk of heart disease. Eating this way helps us maintain a healthy weight as well. However, we don't have to eliminate meat completely to join in. Even having plant-based foods for just one day a week can make a difference.

Choosing plant-based meals also helps protect our planet. This is because raising animals for food, especially beef, not only requires a lot of water and land, but also produces greenhouse gases that lead to climate change. By skipping meat on Mondays, we can help save these natural resources and reduce harm to animals.

Currently, Meatless Monday is active in more than 40 countries and continues to grow every year. In cities like New York and countries like Brazil and France, Meatless Monday lunches are already part of school routines. To help people get started, the movement offers a selection of free meal plans and ideas that any school, community, or individual can follow. It also enables people to try new dishes with regional flavors, made with common ingredients like beans.
