On December 30th, 2023, the Italian city of Venice, announced new limits on the size of tourist groups, the latest move to reduce the pressure of mass tourism on the famous canal(運河) city. Starting in June 2024, groups have been limited to 25 people, or around half the number of people on a tourist bus, and the use of loudspeakers, which can cause "**confusion and disturbances**," have been banned. The policies are aimed at improving the flow of groups through Venice's historic center as well as the heavily visited islands of Murano, Burano and Torcello.

The city previously announced plans to test a new day-visitor fee. The fee, which cost around \$5.45 per person, is applied on 29 peak days between April and mid-July, including most weekends. It's applied to tourists who visit Venice without staying overnight, and is intended to reduce crowds, encourage longer visits and improve the quality of life for Venice residents.

Venice has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1987. However, the UN cultural agency has twice considered placing Venice on its list of heritage sites in danger — partly because of tourism's impact on the fragile lagoon city. The city escaped being placed on the list in 2021 by banning large cruise ships from arriving in central Venice by the Giudecca Canal. The cruise ships had been blamed for pollution and damaging the city's foundations. UNESCO again decided not to place Venice on the list after the city announced in September 2024 that it would introduce the day-visitor charge. The charge had been delayed when tourism was much reduced during the COVID-19 pandemic. Venice received 13 million tourists in 2019, and is expected to receive even more in the coming years.
