

Dapeng Bay is a pouch-shaped lagoon connected to the open sea by a single narrow channel. Spanning this passage is the Dapeng Bay Bridge, whose design is essential to the bay's operation. To allow fishing boats and yachts to pass freely, the bridge was constructed as an opening bridge as opposed to a fixed one.

Notably, the Dapeng Bay Bridge is Taiwan's first bridge that can open upward and fold back down. This opening-and-closing feature has also turned the bridge into a tourist attraction. On weekends, visitors can watch scheduled bridge-opening demonstrations, while evening light shows highlight the structure as a modern landmark. The timing of these events changes with the seasons, beginning earlier in winter to accommodate shorter daylight hours.


