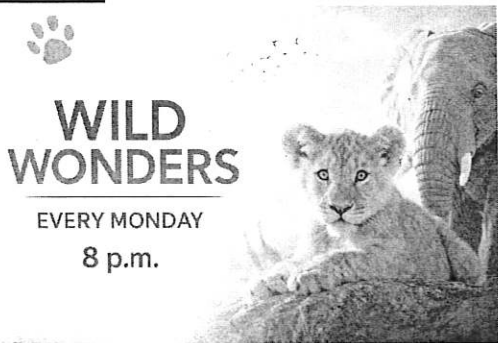

Public attacks can happen at any time and in any place, so people should always be aware of their surroundings. During emergencies, experts suggest following the rule “run, hide, fight.” This means to leave quickly, to hide if necessary, and to __35__ only when there is no other choice.

When danger appears, it's important not to waste time trying to figure out what's happening. Instead, people should get away as soon as possible, warn others, and contact emergency services. Sugar is a type of carbohydrate that __39__ naturally in many foods. Some well-known sugars include glucose, fructose, lactose, and sucrose. Sucrose, or table sugar, is the standard sugar people add to drinks or baking. It's usually __40__ sugarcane or sugar beet. These plants are harvested, processed, and refined until only the crystals you recognize are left. Sugars also appear naturally in everyday foods. __41__, fructose comes from fruit or honey, and lactose comes from milk.
