



Some animals always look wide awake and energetic. The southern viscacha from South America is not one of them—this cute animal looks sleepy most of the time. With its fluffy __31__, half-closed eyes, and relaxed face, it has even become an internet meme.

Southern viscachas live high in the Andes and are easy to spot due to their long tails and large ears. They are __32__ animals and rarely live alone. They make loud calls to warn each other when predators like foxes and wildcats approach. Staying close together increases their safety.

Passage 2

Aphasia occurs when a person's brain gets damaged, usually from a stroke or brain infection. This condition changes how people use language. Specifically, __35__ have aphasia may struggle to speak, read, write, or understand what others are saying. However, it does not affect their intelligence.

There are two main types of aphasia. The first is Wernicke's aphasia, which happens when a __36__ of the left side of the brain is hurt. People with this type often speak smoothly. In spite of this, their sentences can be confusing or hard to follow. They might choose the wrong words or even make up new ones without realizing it.

The second type is Broca's aphasia. People with this condition usually understand language well, but their __37__ comes out slowly and sounds broken. They often pause between words and leave out small function words like "is" or "the."

While Wernicke's aphasia and Broca's aphasia cause different language problems, they both __38__ something __38__: with early therapy, regular practice, and the right support, people can improve over time.

Bone conduction headphones let you enjoy music without covering your ears or putting anything inside them. These headphones send sound directly to your inner ear through small vibrations in your skull. Because your ears __39__ open, you can still hear the world around you while listening to music.

This design makes outdoor activities safer. Many people find them useful for cycling and running. Bone conduction headphones may also __40__ people with ear problems. They reduce discomfort in the ear canal and are comfortable to use __41__.

These headphones do have limits, however. The sound may not be as powerful as traditional headphones. Plus, outside noise can easily mix with your music. Another common __42__ from users is that constant vibrations can cause discomfort and headaches.

Nothing says "Taiwan" like a traditional Gaji bag. These strong, lightweight, and easy-to-carry bags were originally made of a kind of grass found in wetlands. Farmers in the Houbi area wove them by hand, and people used them to carry produce during Japanese rule (1895–1945). In the 1960s, nylon materials took the place of plant fibers, and the famous red, green, and blue stripe pattern was introduced. The change in material made it easier for Gaji bags to be mass-produced. Soon, the bags spread across the island. Although they became less popular in the 1980s when plastic bags were common, Gaji bags are back in fashion now.

Make your own eco-friendly tricolor Gaji bag in a fun workshop! We will make large Gaji bags featuring a zipper, two pockets, and two handles. The teacher will guide you through every step. Students will learn to cut out the fabric with a pattern and stitch it using a sewing machine. The studio has six sewing machines and three irons.
