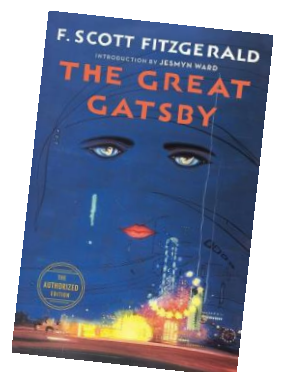

我的觀點：

The Great Gatsby tells a sentimental story in a prosperous time. From the narrator, Nick, we can see the inner struggle of a millionaire named Gatsby. Jay Gatsby, known as a murderer, an Oxford graduate, and a descendant of a wealthy family, is a mysterious character in the book. A few years ago, Gatsby fell in love with Daisy, but when he left his place to join a war, Daisy married Tom and became Mrs. Buchannan. After the war, Gatsby became rich and bought a mansion that is directly across from the home of Buchannan. Thereafter, he has lived a luxurious life just to attract Daisy's attention and be with her again. After reading The Great Gatsby, I learned a lot about interpersonal relationships and have a deeper understanding of how American society then worked. There are three main points in the novel: the extravagant luxury, the value of love, and the hypocrisy of the social system.

The nobles' affluent daily life is one of the most important elements in The Great Gatsby. The following is how the author describes Gatsby's luxurious life. Gatsby lives in a mansion which is as magnificent as a castle, and this is where he revels with other magnates. Every time Gatsby appears, he is always dressed in an expensive suit and drives a fancy car. The lifestyle is beyond the belief of ordinary residents such as Nick. It also reminds us of the disparity between the rich and the poor. While the rich are spending frivolously on unnecessary things, thousands of beggars are still starving. Furthermore, the same phenomenon can also be seen in modern Taiwan. Take Taipei City for example. It is the wealthiest city in Taiwan. However, the city is also home to over one hundred thousand paupers. As far as I am concerned, the social issue needs to be solved immediately before it is too late.

The book revolves around Gatsby and Daisy's relationship. Daisy is a girl whom Gatsby loves in his youth. As the five years

pass, Gatsby meets Daisy again and gets the opportunity to confess his feelings for her. After they fall in love again, Gatsby explains that he wants Daisy to tell her husband she never loves him. The question is: how valuable is love? Is it worthwhile for Daisy to give up her family just to be with an old friend? After reading the novel, I realize that pursuing love blindly is unrealistic. Our pursuit of love will lead to nothing if we disregard everything.

From the conversations and behaviors among the characters, I can feel the hypocrisy of the social system in the story. While reading The Great Gatsby, I find that some of the characters do not treat others sincerely. They may pack their true intentions with lies and concealments. In my opinion, such actions are like wearing a mask on some social occasions. Hypocrisy between people still commonly exists in modern society. In numerous formal occasions, such as companies and schools, we usually have to hide our true feelings and thoughts to maintain a peaceful relationship with our superiors and teachers. Only by doing so can we protect our interests and get a guarantee of a stable life.

In summary, The Great Gatsby is a classic social satire. From my perspective, the interactions between characters are the most fascinating part of the novel. From the way the Buchannan couple get along with each other, we can predict the destruction of their marriage. From Gatsby's sayings and manners, we will gradually become familiar with the mysterious millionaire and eventually are attracted by his outstanding personality. Through Nick's viewpoints toward other characters, we will feel his thoughtfulness and integrity. Every slight movement is a brick that the author used to build the worldview of The Great Gatsby. The most ironic part is Gatsby's death. He is still waiting for Daisy until he draws his last breath. Regardless of his wealth, he cannot obtain the happiness he anticipates. The ending also reminds us that what decides our destiny is not our identity, power, or even property. It is our minds and behaviors that define our lives.
