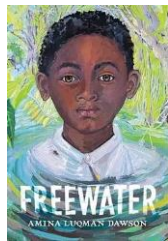

書名：《Freewater》

圖書作者與內容簡介：

Freewater by Amina Luqman-Dawson tells the story of enslaved children who escape to the swamps of the South, forming a hidden community rather than fleeing to the North. Inspired by the Great Dismal Swamp maroons, the novel highlights how the swamp's dangers protected those who escaped slavery. The book focuses on children, including the young daughter of a slaveowner who helps facilitate the escapes. Freewater received critical acclaim, winning the 2023 Coretta Scott King Award.

### 內容摘錄：

Master Crumb's father had made a gift of Old Joe to his son on his wedding day. I'd seen many kinds of ways we moved from one place to another. We were sold, loaned, taken, and ran away, but gifting was the strangest. Gifts sound nice, but slave moving was always ugly. It didn't seem right to call it gifting. (p.18)

### 我的觀點：

Freewater is a story based on maroon communities in the south and tells the story of survival, friendship, and courage. It is a story about 12-year-old Homer, a boy who flees the plantation where he lives and works as a slave with his mom and sister. He takes her sister to escape to Southerland. Through his journey, he found a secret community called Freewater. He makes a lot of friends and allies in this special place, but he also finds out although he is in "Freewater", it is not truly free. This is Amina Luqman-Dawson debut book, but Freewater won Newbery Award, and it's accrued as a host of other awards.

Author Amina Luqman-Dawson uses multiply viewpoints to let readers see the story in different eyes and give us a much richer understanding of the story. Therefore, we can interpret the story not only from Homer but from other characters' perspectives. Each character has their own story, which is reflected in their actions and the meaning behind them. In real life, everyone acts for their own benefits and the people they want to protect. When reading this book, I seemed to possess an omniscient point of view so that I can peek into every character's mind, and I also tried to think about the meaning behind everything the characters did. For example, when Freewater is caught in a fire crisis, every character has their own reason to save this place. Some

are selfish, others focus on justice, and still others they want to protect their children as a result of the parental love.

There is no perfect place. Even the promised land has its own flaws. This story reminds me that what appears to be freedom is often the result of countless sacrifices. In American history, African Americans had to endure unequal treatment to fulfill the demands of white people. Some children were even forced to be separated from their parents. Behind the glorious lives, there are untold stories of suffering and separation. Take Sanzi and Juna, the two Freewater-born sisters, for example. The former, who is bold and full of justice, desires to be like Suleman using bow and arrow to protect Freewater and explore plantation, but the Freewater-born children aren't allowed to leave Freewater since they were born for them plantations were a mystery. The latter Juna was like a slave, following the script her mother gave her. She does everything for her mom. They are not allowed to leave Freewater since they were born, for them the outside world was a mystery.

As a slave, Southland plantation is just like heaven. But Homer would rather go back to the plantation where he flees to save his mom. He clearly knows that he takes a huge risk of being caught along the way. Nevertheless, Homer is not just running, he is fighting for the people he loves and that makes him more powerful. Fortunately, there is a group of friends who want to help him. They give him hope and support. The desire for freedom can make those children overcome unknown challenges ahead since they believe this can let them know what it is to be free.

Freedom is not just about physical escape; instead, it is about the ability to choose your own path and spend your life in your own way. Freewater makes me more empathetic, putting me in the shoes of those who have endured unimaginable hardships and allowing me to see their struggles and their humanity. Every story in Freewater is connected, one life touching another is more than just a group of people. It is about hope, about finding the bright side even in the darkest places. It is a living, breathing entity. Freewater gives us a deep understanding of the history of black slaves in the United States

### 討論議題：

Freewater helped me learn more about African Americans history. At that time, they were no longer human but commodities, being auctioned and transferred by merchant's countless times. Many years later, how do we view the world today with the history we have learned?
